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Letter from the Minister

To the Community of Faith at Lennoxville United,

Greetings in the name of Christ; may we continue to follow the peasant Jew who calls us to follow in love trusting that God is with us as we go. This past year included great struggle, much challenge, and a worrisome dose of fear; and we, as a community of faith, responded to this unknown with hope, love and the willingness to show others that "we are not alone." 2020 will be forever known as the year that we experienced church exile. In March, the World Health Organization declared the Covid-19 pandemic, and out of caution we moved our Christian practice out of the church building. This past year, Lennoxville United Church has continued to serve our community, while fostering spiritual growth through the challenges created by the pandemic. Your creativity has been impressive, as we brought new visions to life. We resisted simply adopting a survival mode of operation, and instead trusted in the Holy Spirit's ability to help us to thrive despite the struggle. This past year was not 'business as usual' and I continue to trust that Lennoxville United Church will be better for it.

I am grateful for the work and care given by many leaders within our community of faith. Our Church Council held their first internet meeting on Zoom at the end of March, and continued to provide leadership during uncertain times. In July, we added a temporary committee to our list of Ministry Teams, and the Covid Building Team continues to guide how we mitigate risks in our building. The Worship Team gathered small groups to worship both outside and in the Upper Hall, and created a different order of worship holding 2 "Parades of Offerings" that gave us the opportunity to serve our community while offering comfort through the familiarity of our church sanctuary. The impressive collaboration of the United Church Women, the OutReach Team, the Worship Team, and the Family Ministry Team created an Advent Season that spread the Christian worship, and we made Queen St. a little brighter with our outdoor Community Christmas Tree. Despite the struggle, despite the darkness, Lennoxville United Church shone the light of Christ while being witnesses to the truth that "we are not alone."

The story told within the prophet Jeremiah is of trust in a God who moves with us as we face the struggles of living. We have been living through a sort of exile, but as Christians we trust that there is much to learn even in the suffering. We have learnt how to gather our hearts in prayer, even while we must remain apart. We have reached out with care, even while keeping our hands to ourselves. We have been witnesses of God's love for all Creation. May we continue to follow Jesus into the unknown, and may this time of struggle lead to transformation for the sake of the whole people of God, remembering that "we are not alone."

Council Report

Unprecedented, this is the word most used as a label for 2020. Our very first council meeting following the Annual Congregational Meeting in 2020 was held virtually via Zoom, a novelty then, but commonplace now.

Council met nine times this year, focusing primarily on meeting Covid-19 protocols, identifying and implementing new spiritual practices for our faith community, ensuring the financial health of our church, all while navigating the constantly changing pandemic environment.

Weekly worship moved to Facebook live, small outdoor services were held when possible, and "Parades of Offering" appeared, allowing brief but meaningful visits to the sanctuary.

It is not the year we were planning for, but given the circumstances, we have been able to proceed safely for our congregation. We see light at the end of the tunnel, with vaccines now in distribution.

We have experienced isolation, unemployment, illness and fear of illness. We have been asked to sacrifice, to hope and to act with compassion. I wonder what our world, and our faith community, will retain from this past year? I have noted throughout all this that although we are all in it together, we are not all impacted equally. I, for example, am an introvert, I live with my wife and son, my family is near, and I have good health. I have worked from home in a well-equipped office for years, suffered no loss of employment during the pandemic, nor did my wife, daughter and son. I have a lovely home equipped with patio, pool and pets. Few have all these comforts to cushion the effects of the pandemic.

I have also reflected that the hardships we are experiencing, as a result of the pandemic, are not new to many people. Before Covid-19, people were isolated, lonely, without family, without employment, struggling to pay bills, and were vulnerable to, and lived-in fear of illness. There were funerals with empty funeral parlors. The tragedy was there before Covid-19 and it will still exist when this pandemic is a memory. Having experienced the hardships of our pandemic, will we be more conscious of the continued suffering of others? Will we be more compassionate and act as God urges us to act? With what we have lived and seen, we should.

I would like to thank our members of Council whose insight I am very grateful for: Reverend Linda Buchanan, Esther Barnett (Secretary), Jack Noble (Treasurer) and Debbie Harrison (Recording Secretary); with representatives from each team and committee: Bob Davidson (Board of Trustees), Frankie Noble (United Church Women), Sandy Davidson (Buildings and Finance), David McCormack (Ministry and Personnel), Carolyn Leonard Gilchrist (Family Ministries), Pam Wilson (Outreach) and Bruce Gilbert (Worship). I would also like to thank the many people who serve our community of faith daily: Debbie Harrison our office administrator, Eric Nutbrown our church caretaker, Maryse Simard our organist and choir director, Bruce Durrant who maintains our web site, Jamie Crooks and his talented friends who have had such a great impact on our Parade of offering. Finally, we are thankful and appreciative of Reverend Linda Buchanan, who has proven to be adaptive and innovative in bringing us the teachings of Christ despite the challenges of the pandemic.

Resumé of Team's Activities during 2020

Building:

The Team continued to implement its list of 2020 Repairs and Maintenance Priorities and relocated all the items previously stored in a room to the left of the stage to a newlycreated storage area in the large Sunday School room, thanks to the efforts of Sandy and Bob Davidson. All items are now stored in labelled containers provided by the UCW. It was determined that the safety bars in the two washrooms are adequate and that all interior door locks have been removed. The Emergency Response Team (ERT) has been formed and their contact information has been posted. Following a request for tenders it was decided to engage Ricky Loiselle to replace the Manse Roof as, at \$6,000., his was the lowest bid received. It was agreed to discontinue purchasing bulletin covers for an annual saving of \$869.

Finance:

One mandate of our Team was to ensure that the day-to-day and long-term financial obligations of the Church could be met in a timely fashion given that the amount of regular income received in 2020 substantially decreased due to COVID-19 closures. Therefore, it was deemed prudent to apply for the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy which permitted the financing of salaries. To date, Lennoxville United has received \$57,384 from this subsidy which Treasurer Jack Noble applies for each month. However, it was still necessary to accept a \$5,000. transfer from the UCW at the start of the year. It has also been helpful that many parishioners contributed through PAR (Pre-Authorized Remittance) with others being willing to use the on-line donation service "Canada Helps".

We are blessed that so many members give so generously of their time, energy and talent in undertaking many of the repair and maintenance projects which otherwise would necessitate paying for these services. It should be noted that Mr. and Mrs. Donald Wright asked to be replaced as outdoor maintenance providers and to this end, Sandy Davidson obtained the services of the Manse tenants who agreed to assume this task for a mutually agreed-upon reduction in their rent. We are also grateful to Jim Davidson for clearing the snow in the parking lot.

Unfortunately, due to COVID-19 restrictions it was not possible to pursue negotiations concerning a potential rental agreement with the Huntingville IOOF.

Resume of Team's Activities During 2020

The COVID-19 Task Team was formed in late June in response to Regional Council's request to have plans and protocols in place as churches progressively reopened after various degrees of being locked down due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The key activities of the COVID-19 Task Team in 2020 were:

The intention was to plan monthly Messy Church events for the core 6 month period, of which included "Travelling Messy Church".

The first "Travelling Messy Church" of 2020 was held in January at the United Church in Richmond. The Messy Church event took place in Lennoxville United on February 23, 2020 was that of the Sleigh Ride, followed by refreshments and fellowship. Approximately 35 people attended.

The onset of the Pandemic in March interrupted all events planned for both Sunday school programs and Messy Church. Two zoom Messy Church events were attempted in April and June but put on pause for the duration of the Pandemic however well worth the attempt.

The Family Ministries Team held a short meeting on September 22, 2020 to touch base and explore various ideas that would help stay connected with our young families and those who attended Messy Church.

Considering that Messy Church is an "open event" it was deemed rather difficult to set up an effective means of reaching out to all families. It was said that if anyone learns of a family in need of support to cope during the Pandemic, or would appreciate some form of Pastoral Care, to inform Rev. Buchanan. Rev. Buchanan sent a "back to school" message to all families and post High School students who are connected regularly to Messy Church or otherwise.

All Sunday school and Messy Church activities were suspended. This proved to be quite challenging but was an important experience. Rev. Buchanan hosted a "children's Nativity Christmas Eve service" on Facebook, on Christmas Eve. No other children's services/activities on a virtual platform have been attempted but families have been able to connect to Shanna Bernier's "Children's Live Church" on Facebook on Sunday mornings.

Considering the fact that we were not permitted to put the traditional Advent program of readings and the lighting of candles in the Advent Wreath this year due to the Pandemic, an Advent Tree was added outdoors and all families and the community at large were invited to bring a decoration to add to the tree every Sunday. The lights were set to light up the tree each day at 4:30pm and the star was lit on Christmas Eve. The 15 foot tree was beautifully adorned with colored lights for the duration of the Season of Advent, with decorations added each Sunday, surrounded by "Peace, Love, Joy and Hope" signs that were made by Kristan and Joe McKercher. This project was successful due to the unanimous collaboration of various people representing the various Teams of Lennoxville United.

Resumé of Team's Activities during 2020

The UCW met only three times in 2019 due to COVID-19: regularly constituted meetings on January 20th and February 17th and an ad hoc meeting on November 5th with only five members (Carolyn Gilchrist, Sandy Davidson, Wendy Durrant, Gloria Stronach and Kristan McKercher) in attendance, thus a quorum could not be established. UCW members also decorated the Sanctuary (and the Upper Hall) for Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Due to COVID-19 our regular fund-raising projects could not be held and it was therefore agreed that the UCW sponsor an on-line Bake Sale and an on-line Auction. Coordination of the Bake and Candy Sale, held from Nov. 17th to Dec. 2nd. was assumed by Sandy Davidson and the on-line Auction was organized by Carolyn Gilchrist and held from November 29th to December 13th. Both events were very well-received and patronized. Like the presence of the outdoor Advent Tree, these fund-raisers, while not as financially rewarding as our regular events, injected a dash of Christmas Spirit into a community that had been finding the season decidedly un-Christmas-y!

We have tried to continue our outreach services and to remember our Church family during times of illness and sorrow as well as in times of joy and celebration.

Several of our members also sit as members of various other LUC Teams and as the Representatives to Council from these various Teams.
