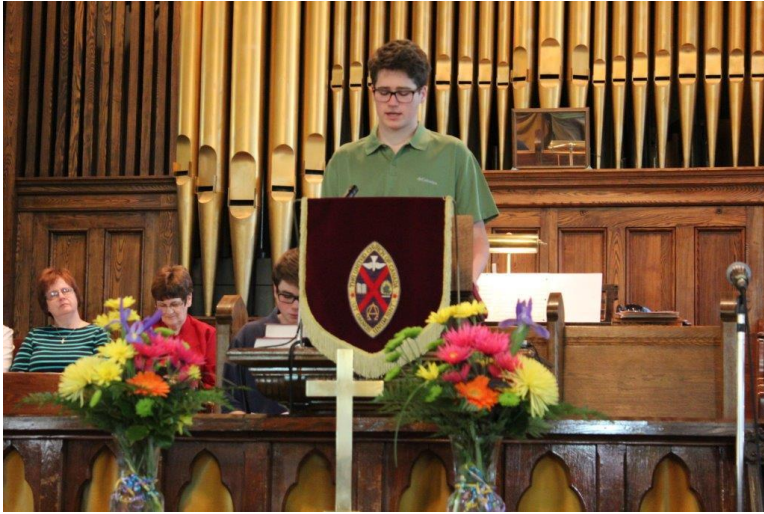


## Youth Group “Rite of Passage - 2014
